Early Child. Ed. BA 2017

The Early Childhood Education (ECE) Major with Recommendation for Teacher Certification requires 63 total credits in the major. ECE majors must also complete a course of study that includes a prescribed sequence of LAS Core courses that differs slightly from the Core requirements for other majors. No more than 32 credits of LAS Core classes will be accepted in transfer. Advanced Placement (AP) and transfer credit will be evaluated on an individual basis. Students are required to complete a Focus Area (or minor if available) of credits that can overlap with the LAS Core. Please see your advisor before selecting a Focus Area or minor.

Students must earn a grade of C or better in English Composition and Mathematics, and maintain an overall GPA of 2.5 or better in all LAS Core courses. Students must earn a minimum grade of B- or better in all Early Childhood Education courses and a minimum GPA of 2.5. A maximum of 2 grades of C are allowed in Early Childhood Education courses. Course grades lower than a C will not be counted toward the degree.
