42 credits required. Grade of C or better required in all major courses. The Photography Department supports a wide range of serious photographic genres. Central to the Photography Department's curricular structure is the idea that all undergraduate students in photography will receive a core foundation, which encompasses a broad range of photographic practices. The common goals and objectives for all BA students are: 1. Students will demonstrate the ability to produce photographic work consistent with high professional standards. 2. Students will demonstrate an applied understanding of the visual grammar of photography and the ability to incorporate technical, formal and conceptual competencies in their creative work. 3. Students will be able to articulate in verbal and written form the key technical, formal and conceptual issues in their creative work and the work of others. 4. Students will develop portfolios representative of their advanced photography coursework. 5. Students will demonstrate a comprehensive understanding of the history of photography and contemporary photographic practice and be able to relate their work to this history and practice.
