12 credits required for MA students. 18 credits required for non-MA students. Grade of "B" or better required in all courses. CGPA of 3.0 or better required.

The Graduate Laban Certificate in Movement Analysis program supports the core objectives of the Department of Dance/Movement Therapy and Counseling with which it is affiliated. Students who successfully complete the GLCMA will be able to:

- Knowledge of the body and how its systems affect functional, expressive, communicative and developmental aspects of movement.
- Knowledge and application of methods and techniques for observation and assessment of verbal and non-verbal communication in Laban Movement Analysis and related applied Laban based systems.
- Development of the reflective use of self in understanding ethical therapeutic, educational, and artistic relationships.
- Understanding and embodiment of Laban specific semiotics.

Each outcome will be accomplished through engaging course material and projects, all of which address kinesthetic, analytic and theoretical competencies in an integrated manner.
