¹ *Semesters to degree completion are calculated assuming 60 total credits in transfer with all Liberal Arts & Sciences Core requirements complete and no major requirements transferred in. Students needing to take additional Liberal Arts & Sciences Core courses may require additional semesters to complete the degree. for information on individual course equivalencies. Full-time status at Columbia College Chicago is 12-16 credits per term. All degree-seeking undergraduate students are required to complete Global Awareness (3 credits), U.S. Pluralism (3 credits), Writing Intensive (3 credits), and upper division (2000 level or higher) LAS core courses (6 credits). Except for Writing Intensive, these requirements may be met in transfer.

This major is intended to be complemented by a minor; it is highly recommended that Mobile Media Programming majors pursue a minor in Marketing, Public Relations, Creative Advertising, or Professional Writing.

NOTES:

- This transfer plan is based on the degree requirements effective Fall 2015. Students who started prior to or after the Fall 2015 semester may have different overall degree requirements. Please consult with your advisors.
- Low enrollment or other issues may prevent a course from being offered in a certain semester. Please consult with your advisor if you are unable to register for a course that you need to graduate.
- Please consult individual course descriptions in the school catalog to determine any pre-requisites, co-requisites, or other requirements necessary to take the course. (The course catalog is available at <http://catalog.colum.edu/>)
- College Wide Elective courses may be additional IAM courses, LAS courses, minor requirements, or any courses bearing credits toward the overall graduation requirements.
- Please consult with your IAM faculty advisor yearly to insure you are taking the correct courses in the correct sequence.
- Although it is possible to take multiple programming language classes in the same semester, it may be confusing to learn two different languages at the same time (it would be similar to learning Spanish and German for the first time in the same semester). This compressed plan requires multiple language courses to be taken simultaneously.
- IAM Team typically runs only in the Spring semester.
