80 credits required. Grade of "C" or better required in all major courses. GPA of 3.0 or better in the major required for all BFA candidates. Upon successful completion of this program, students will be able to: 1. Work through the critical phases of the design process, as established and required within professional interior architecture practice. 2. Participate as an entry-level professional within the architecture and design community, with a competent level of creative, intellectual, and technical skills as required by CIDA (Council for Interior Design Accreditation). 3. Demonstrate comprehensive knowledge of the built environment and its physiological, psychological, and social effects on the user, to assure that health, life safety, welfare, and sustainability concerns are incorporated. 4. Have an understanding of design tools (design concept, circulation patterns, overall atmosphere, materials, lighting) that enhance the built environment and support the client's intention. 5. Be qualified, with the addition of 2 years professional experience, to sit for the NCIDQ (National Council for Interior Design Qualification) exam. Additional notes: History of Art I and II do not count toward the LAS Core. If you are completing the Art History Minor, History of Art I and II (22-1101/22-1102) and History of Architecture I - OR- II (22-1131 - OR- 22-1132) and History of Architecture I - OR- II (22-1131 - OR- 22-1132) will double count toward the minor. No other courses will double count for both the major and the minor.
