44 credits required. Grade of C or better required in all major courses.

Upon successful completion of this program, students will:

- Generate original comic material using a variety of methods, including ensemble improvisation, solo writing, and group collaboration.
- Develop their personal voice and point of view as a comic artist.
- Develop the analytic skills and vocabulary needed to revise their original work based on feedback.
- Develop competencies that allow them to translate their work into a variety of media, especially live performance and video.

- All Theatre majors are required to take the Foundation sequence, -OR- you may take the Alternate sequence with Theatre Faculty Advisor assistance.
