Students needing to take additional Liberal Arts & Sciences Core courses may require additional semesters to complete the degree. Students may lessen the length of time to degree completion by transferring in applicable major courses. Please see <http://www.transferology.com/school/colum> for information on individual course equivalencies. Full-time status at Columbia College Chicago is 12-16 credits per term. All degree-seeking undergraduate students are required to complete Global Awareness (3 credits), U.S. Pluralism (3 credits), Writing Intensive (3 credits), and upper division (2000 level or higher) LAS core courses (6 credits). Except for Writing Intensive, these requirements may be met in transfer.
