A minimum of 60 CREDITS are required for the MFA degree in IA Book & Paper Arts. FROM THE COLLEGE GRADUATE ACADEMIC POLICY HANDBOOK: Candidates for master's degrees and graduate certificates must present a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 (B) in graduate course work. No more than six credits of course work with a grade of 2.0 (C) may be applied toward a graduate degree or certificate.
